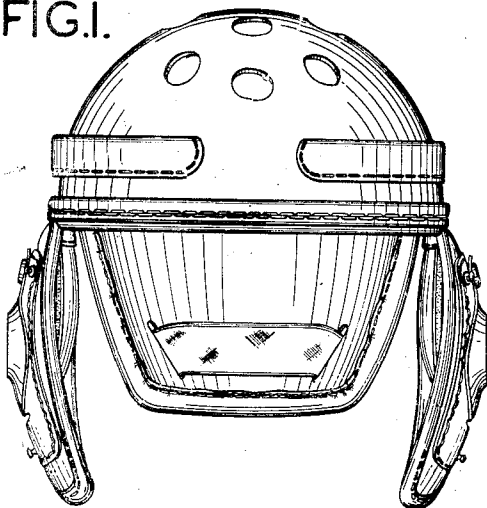

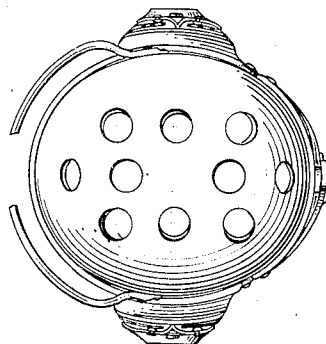

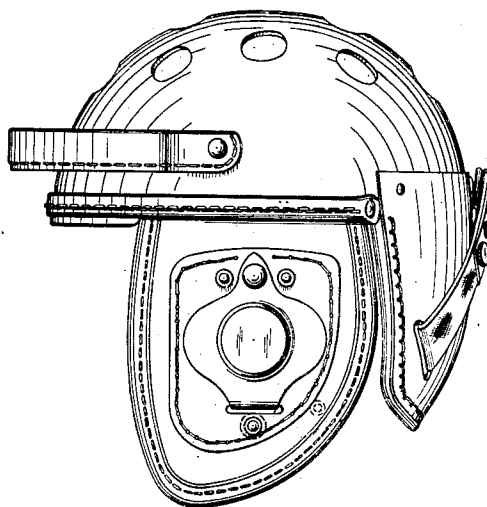
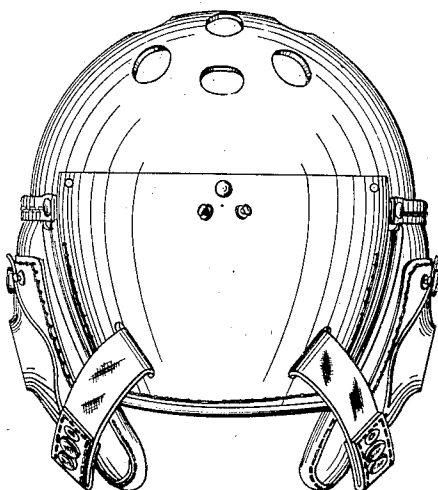

## DESIGN FOR A PROTECTIVE HELMET

*To all whom it may concern:*

Be it known that we, Mason Scudder, Elmer Nolte, and Harry B. Latina, citizens of the United States, and residing, respectively, in Clayton, St. Louis County, Missouri, St. Louis, Missouri, and East St. Louis, Illinois, have invented a new, original, and ornamental Design for a Protective Helmet, of which the following is a specification, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, forming part thereof.

Figure 1 is a front elevational view of a protective helmet, showing our new design.

Figure 2 is a side elevational view thereof,

with the back straps shown in their inoperative position.

Figure 3 is a rear elevational view thereof, with the back straps shown attached to the ear flaps; and

Figure 4 is a top plan view of Figure 3.
